CRRSAA and ARP (a)(1) Student Grant Program

National Aviation Academy has provided 100% of all grant aid from the HEERF programs as direct payments to student and has retained zero funds for the institution. HEERF I & II were previously reported at final.

CRRSAA and ARP (a)(4) Student Grant Programs

- (1) National Aviation Academy of Mississippi Inc. has signed and returned to the Department the Certifications and Agreements and the assurance that the institution has used the applicable amount of funds designated under the CRRSAA and ARP (a)(1) and (a)(4) HEERF I & II III programs to provide Emergency Financial Aid Grants to Students. All grant funds have been 100% distributed to students.
- (2) For Fourth Quarter ended Dec 31, 2021, the institution has made two distributions of ARP (a)(4) funds to eligible students at each of its campuses comprising 100% of all grant funds received. The cumulative amount of

 - HEERF I 100% of all grants funds were distributed to students with the institution not retaining any portion.
 The distributions included \$1,950,415 directly to students at the Florida Campus (OPEID 03035900), grant
 #P425E200381 and \$625,133 directly to students at the New England Campus (OPEID 00613600), grant
 #P425E200395
 - HEERF II 100% of all grant funds were distributed to students with the institution not retaining any portion.
 The distribution included \$958,240 directly to students at the Florida Campus (03035900, grant # P425F202893)
 and \$357,840 directly to students at the New England Campus (00613600, grant # P425F202894)

The Total Amount of Emergency Financial Aid Grants distributed to students under ARP (a) (4) for proprietary schools to date is \$ 762,771 including:

HEERF III (a)(4) – 100% distributed to students as required. The distribution included \$ 553,733 directly to students at the Florida Campus (03035900, grant # P425Q210825) and \$209,038 directly to students at the New England Campus (00613600, grant # P425Q210857)

- (4) The estimated number of students who were eligible to receive grants under the CRRSAA was 1,617
 - 1,207 students at the Florida Campus
 - 410 students at the New England Campus

and ARP(a)(4) grants was 807

- 614 students at the Florida Campus
- 193 students at the New England Campus
- (5) The number of eligible students who received grant funds under the CRRSAA was 1,611
 - 1,206 students at the Florida Campus
 - 405 students at the New England Campus
 - 2 eligible students declined a grant in writing and 4 did not respond to communications

Grants to Students under ARP (a)(4) programs was:

- 614 students at the Florida Campus
- 193 students at the New England Campus
- A Total of 807 students received grant distributions of HEERF III
- (6) For Q4 2021 National Aviation Academy of Mississippi determined the method for appropriate distribution 100% of all of the grant funds received under APR (a)(4) for proprietary schools directly to students who qualified using the following criteria:
 - On November 18, 2021 National Aviation Academy made the first distribution of 75% of available grant funds,
 prioritizing as required, students with exceptional need who were Pell recipients and enrolled in the institution
 on the determination date of November 12, 2021 \$415,300 was distributed to 417 students at the Clearwater,
 FL campus (OPEID 03035900), grant # P425F202893) and \$156,779 to 98 students at the New England campus

(OPEID 00613600), grant # P425Q210857) Each eligible student signed an acknowledgement of the proper uses of grant funds as described in the regulation. The amount of available funds was distributed evenly among eligible recipients for each campus. Each eligible student received the proportional share of \$995.93 on the FL campus and \$1,599.79 on the New England campus.

- On December 20, 2021 National Aviation Academy made the final distribution to the remaining students without requiring Title IV eligibility in consideration of the hardship impact of Covid on the entire student body and enrolled on the determination date of December 17,2021 \$138,433 was distributed to 197 students at the Clearwater, FL campus (OPEID 03035900), grant # P425Q210825 and \$52,259 was distributed to 95 students at the New England campus (OPEID 00613600), grant # P425Q210857. The amount of available funds was divided evenly among the eligible recipients for each campus.
- Each eligible student signed an acknowledgment of the proper uses of grant funds as described in the regulation.
 Each eligible student received the proportional share of \$702.71 on the FL campus and \$550.10 on the New England campus.

The total amounts disbursed during Q4 2021 was \$553,733 for the Florida campus (OPEID 03035900), grant#
P425Q21082 and \$209,038 for the New England Campus (OPEID 00613600) grant # P425Q210857 respectively. National
Aviation Academy of Mississippi, Inc. acknowledges 100% the funds have been distributed to students determined
eligible for emergency aid within the prescribed timeframe.

Funding will be disbursed in the form of a check by the Business Office no later than *Thursday, November 18, 2021*.
